# ESF+ COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE ON EMPLOYMENT, EDUCATION AND SKILLS PEER REVIEW ON OUTREACH TO (VULNERABLE) YOUNG PERSONS - FINNISH AND PORTUGUESE CASES

## **OBJECTIVES OF THE EVENT**

The event will focus on two practices coming from Portugal and Finland, detailed below, but will also include time to discuss the adaptability of these two approaches, and for reflections from other countries:

- **Finland: youth outreach work.** Outreach is part of youth work services, which are provided by municipalities and NGOs and mainly financed by the Ministry of Education and Culture. Youth outreach workers signpost youths to other services providers within a large local network (including the One-Stop-Shop employment service for youth). Data on youth are also shared in these local networks, and regional governments collect data on youth outreach work, monitor, and assess their activities.
- Portugal: building local networks. The Portuguese PES has recently developed an approach to bring together organisations that work with youth and connect them with each other and the public employment services (PES) via an online platform. An important part of the approach is that disadvantaged youth receive support in tackling their other barriers to work before they visit the PES, where they can receive a job or training offer. In the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, a new outreach strategy has recently been launched to reinvigorate local networks.

### The discussion will be centered around these topics:

- how to set up networks for youth outreach?
- how to guarantee that all those involved have the incentive to put vulnerable youth in contact with services, and how to share resources?
- how to effectively share information and data in such a network?
- how to monitor (and gather data) on the work of those involved, and set incentives?
