Event 20 years *Acceder*

The Acceder Programme was launched by Fundación Secretariado Gitano (FSG) in the year 2000 in Spain, thanks to European Social Fund financing, with the aim of improving the lives of Roma through their access to salaried employment. Since then, Acceder has become a clear benchmark of efficient and result-oriented action with more than 110,000 participants; it has achieved 91,733 work contracts, providing jobs for 33,334 people; it has developed 7,955 training actions; it has accompanied 1,591 self-employment projects; and it has collaborated with 15,967 companies.

After 20 years of good results, FSG wanted to go one step further and verify the value and impact of the Acceder programme as a force for change and equal opportunities in the lives of Roma. To this end, an external impact evaluation of the Acceder programme was commissioned.

We want to present these results and the impact of 20 years of work improving the lives of Roma people at the heart of the European policy making, in Brussels, with the aim of sharing the keys of the success and the lessons learnt of the Acceder programme with key European stakeholders working to provide equal labour inclusion opportunities for Roma.
